TEACH Grant - Exit Material

In order to keep your TEACH Grant from being converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, you must do the follow the:

- You must complete the TEACH Grant Exit Counseling at <u>www.studentloans.gov</u>.
 The Exit Counseling must be completed when you finish or withdraw from your TEACH Grant eligible program.
- 2. TEACH Grant recipients must confirm within 120 days that they intend to fulfill their Agreement to Serve obligations with the Department of Education.
- 3. You must teach full-time for 4 years within 8 years of completing your TEACH Grant eligible program or your Grant will be converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan.
- 4. You must be deemed a "highly qualified" teacher.
- 5. You must teach in a designated low-income school.
- 6. You must teach in one of the following areas: mathematics, science, reading specialist, special education, foreign language, bilingual education or English language acquisition. Or, teach in a shortage area identified by the Department of Education Annual Teacher Shortage Area Nationwide Listing: https://www.tcli.ed.gov/CBSWebApp/tcli/TCLIPubSchoolSearch.jsp.
- 7. You must contact the Department of Education at the end of each service year notifying them that you have successfully completed a year of service. This notification must be made by your school system's Chief Administrative Officer.
